Police Activity

Occurrence Summary

There were 12 persons crimes reported in February. Five of these were assaults, with three resulting in charges laid/recommended and the remaining two still under investigation. Uttering threats and indecent/harassing communications both tied for three occurrences each, with the final occurrence being a case of criminal harassment. The uttering threats files resulted in charges laid/recommended for all three, while the remaining files were concluded with insufficient evidence to proceed.

Property crime dropped by over half of January's call volume, ending the month with 14 occurrences. A single break and enter (residential) was investigated, which is still open/under investigation. Theft under \$5000 accounted for seven occurrences, followed by fraud with four. Oddly enough, mischief, which is usually one of the more frequent occurrences in all jurisdictions, only recorded two occurrences.

A single drug investigation, cocaine trafficking, was opened in February.

Traffic occurrences accounted for 117 occurrences in February, down from 148 in January. Impaired driving accounted for four occurrences, three by alcohol and one by alcohol and drugs combined. Charges were laid/recommended in one of the alcohol occurrences, with the other three occurrences concluded with insufficient evidence to proceed. There were 17 speeding violations issued, and an additional 53 other traffic offences/violations in February. Checkstops accounted for 13 occurrences, and there were no fatal collisions reported.

Overall, 263 occurrences were recorded with 260 of these being founded or still under investigation. This is lower than February 2024, when 393 occurrences (with 379 founded/SUI) were reported, and last month, when 327 occurrences, with 313 founded/SUI, were reported.



Community Policing

Policing Initiatives

- An individual that posed a significant property crime impact in Kings and that escaped from electronic monitoring was located in Kings and faces several property related and breach of condition charges. The person remains in custody at present. Kings members also performed several proactive inquiries with subjects on Probation, Parole, Curfew, Electronic monitoring and following release from jail to encourage prevention following their sentence. Members were also observed proactively doing community engagements including hockey games and care homes.

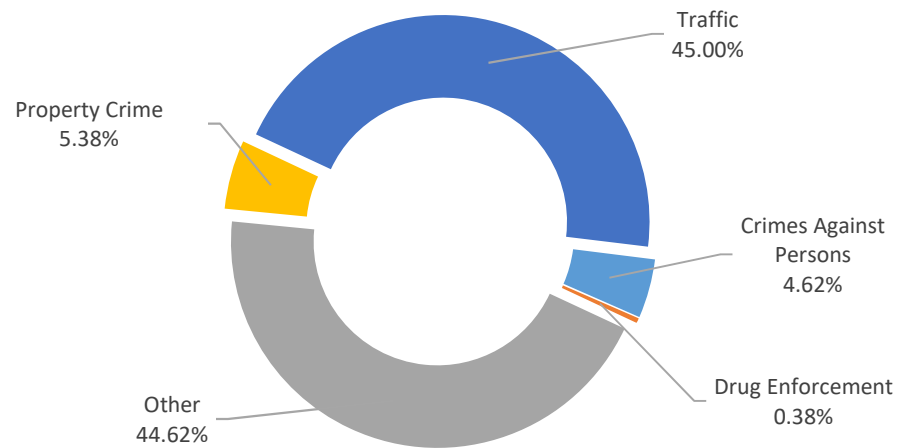
Traffic Enforcement Program

- Checkstops were conducted in Kings District on Feb 1, Feb 7, Feb 9, Feb 11, Feb 13, Feb 15, Feb 17, Feb 20, Feb 23, Feb 24, Feb 25 in Southlake, Orwell, Cherry Valley, Belfast, Dingwell Mills, Pooles Corner, Dundas, St Margarets, Albion, New Perth, Montgaue, St Peters, Avondale, Morell, Georgetown, New Zealand, Bear River, Souris and Vernon River. Only minor infractions were noted and warnings and tickets issued.
- Joint snowmobile checkstops with Conservation on Feb 1 and Feb 7 in Souris, St Catherine's, Five Houses and Montague where operators were found to be within the expectations of the law.

February 2025

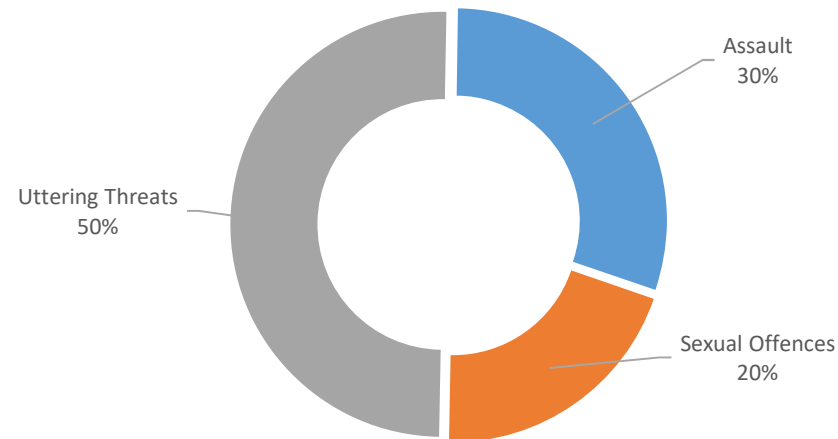

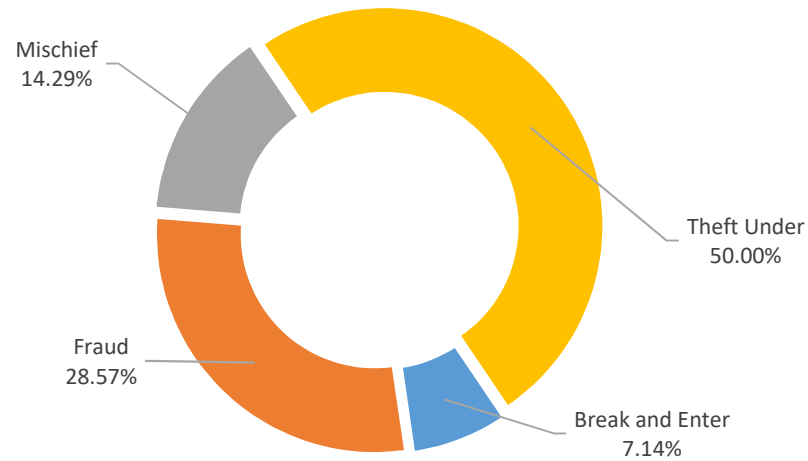


12 Founded/SUI of 268 Total Occurrences

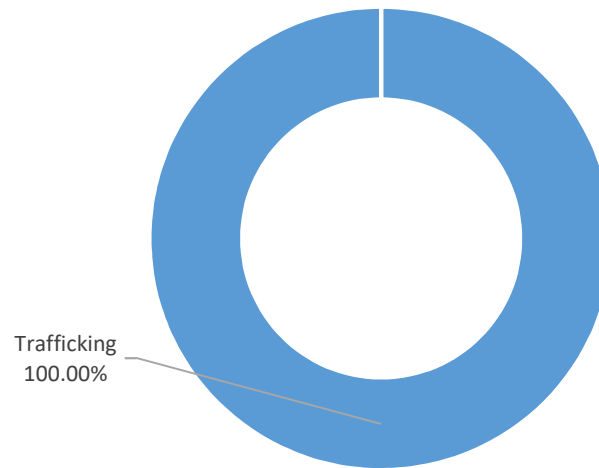


14 Founded/SUI of 268 Total Occurrences

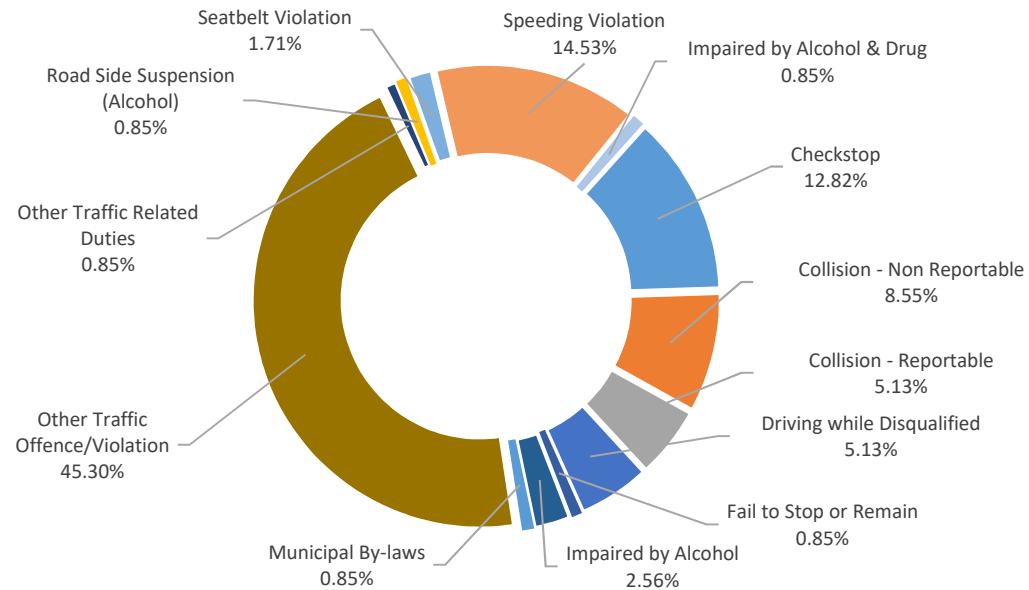


1 Founded/SUI of 268 Total Occurrences

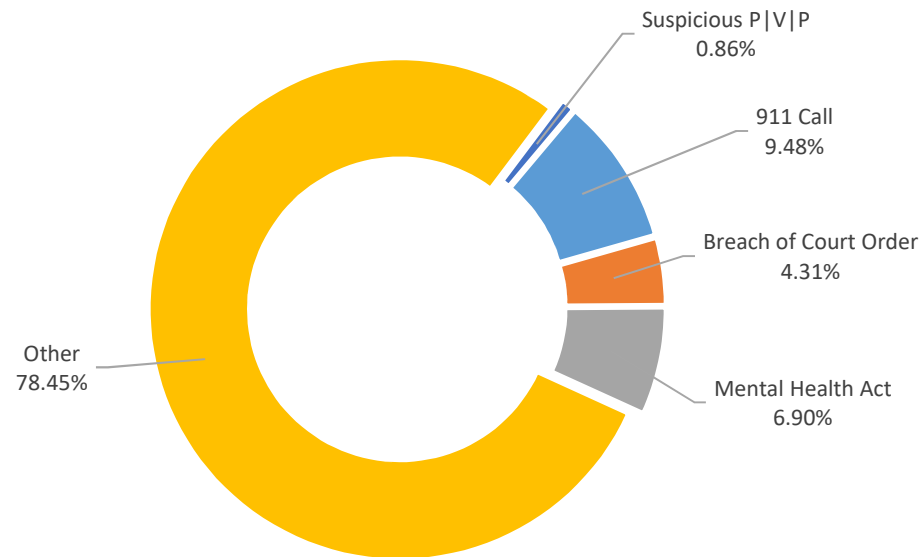


117 Founded/SUI of 268 Total Occurrences

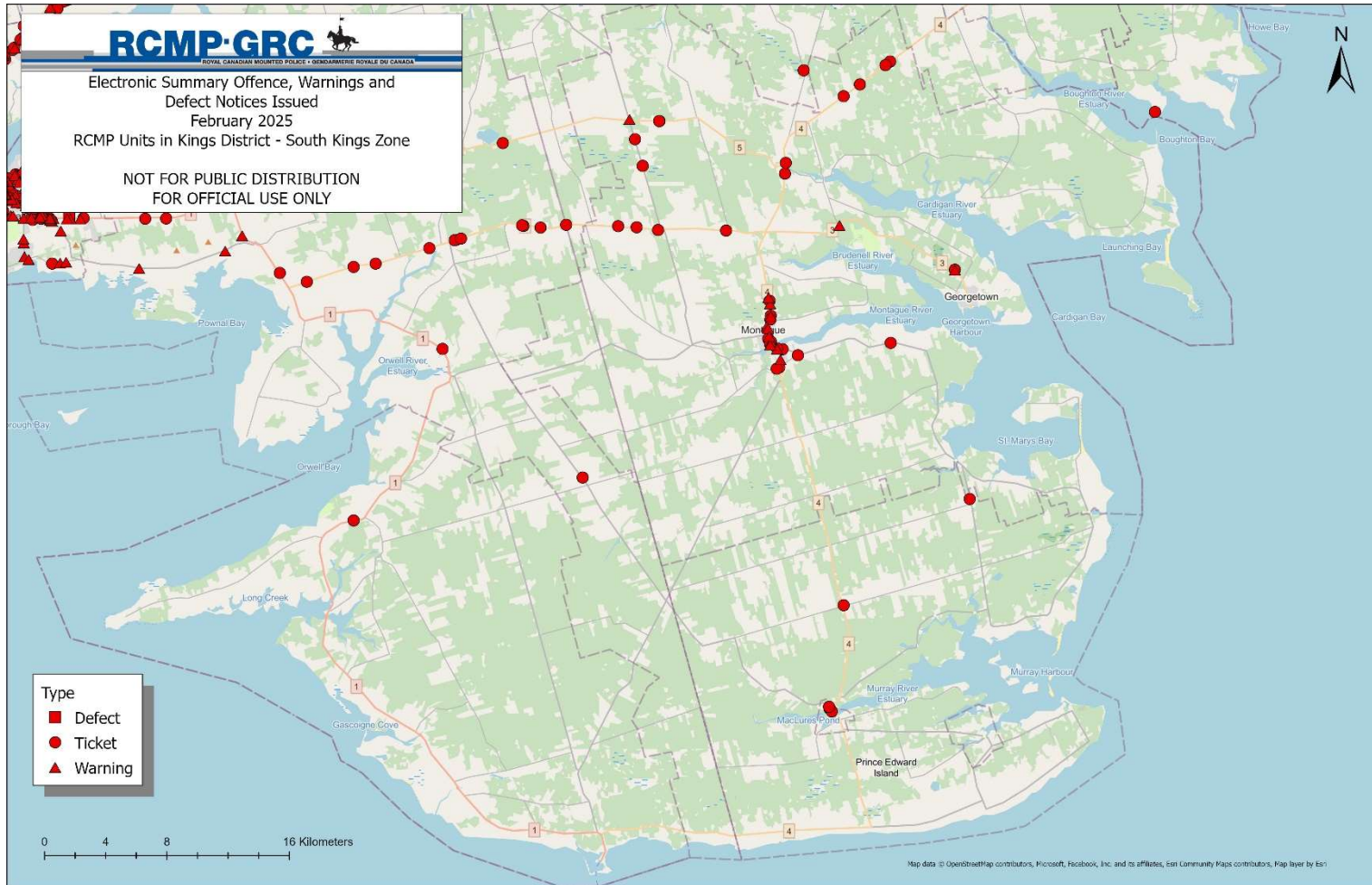

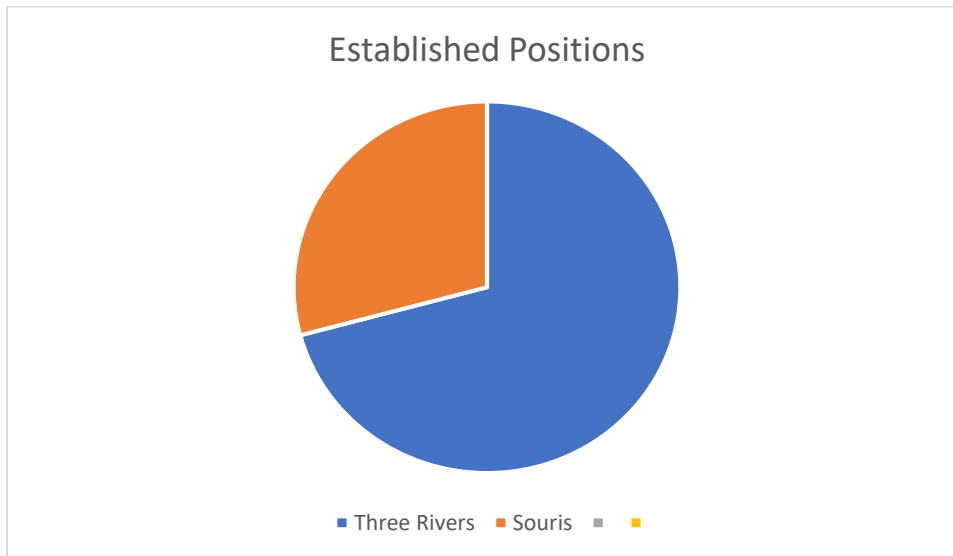
