Police Activity

Occurrence Summary

There were 21 persons crimes in March, up from 12 in February. Assaults accounted for nine (for which six resulted in charges laid/recommended), and an arson with disregard for human life. The suspect in that matter has been arrested and charges have been laid. Three sexual offences were reported, one is open/still under investigation while a second is concluded as the suspect is involved in other criminal matters. The remaining activity involves uttering threats (4) and indecent/harassing communications.

Property crime accounted for 38 occurrences, up slightly from 33. Arson activity increased, with two separate occurrences. Charges have been laid in both occurrences, and two separate and unrelated suspects have been arrested. There were 22 mischief occurrences reported with seven frauds. A variety of thefts were reported, with one theft over \$5000, five thefts under \$5000, and a single shoplifting. No charges have been laid in these files. A single taking motor vehicle without consent resulted in the suspect identified but no charges laid at the request of the complainant.

There were no drug enforcement occurrences reported in March.

Traffic occurrences dropped from 255 in February to 150 in March. Impaired driving occurrences accounted for eight, with four by alcohol and four by drug. Of these, three of the alcohol-related and two of the drug-related occurrences resulted in charges, while the remaining two drug-related occurrences are open/still under investigation. There were 29 speeding violations recorded, along with 85 other traffic offences/violations. No fatal collisions occurred, and 10 Checkstops were documented.

Overall, 351 occurrences were recorded with 335 of these being founded or still under investigation. This is lower than March 2024, when 378 occurrences (with 356 founded/SUI) were reported, and last month, when 393 occurrences, with 379 founded/SUI, were reported.



Community Policing

Policing Initiatives

An individual that is a known offender in Kings was sentenced to federal time for two years. Kings Members also performed 6 curfew checks, arrested an unlawfully at large individual and monitored 5 people released from being incarcerated that included post release in pers on visits and partnered with Parole Board to monitor subjects n the community or provide disclosure to assist with their decisions. Kings RCMP also found time to participate in community events that included visits to the Over 50 club in Cardigan, coaching soccer and hockey and two RCMP recruiting sessions. Three members were also provided mini drone training and will be acquiring their own units and one is planned to be sent on the National Marine Foundations Training.

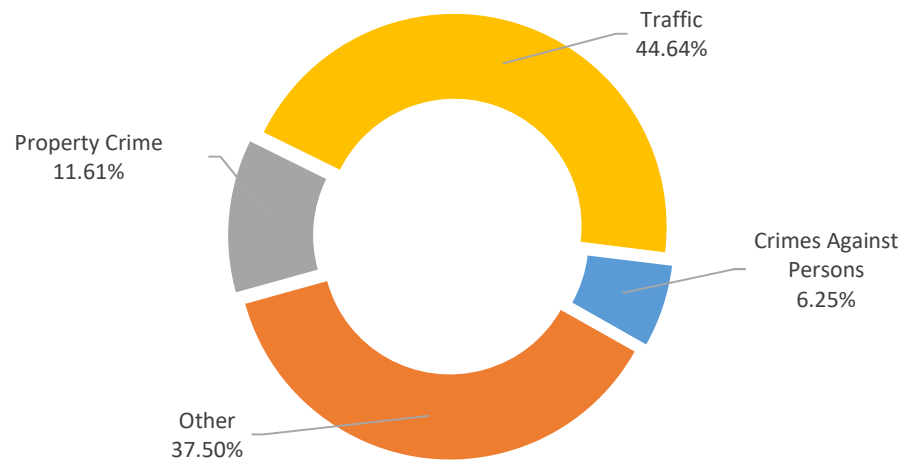
Selective Traffic Enforcement Program

- 2025-03-01 – Route 3 –Pooles Corner to Georgetown, 90km/h zone, 15 cars observed. In the 40km/h zone in Georgetown. Several cars issued warnings for speed and burned-out headlight.
- 2025-03-01 – Route 3 - STEP traffic (Vernon River area) – Route 3, between Baldwin Rd to Cherry Valley, 90km/hr zone. Very little traffic observed. Zone 90km/hr and 70 km/hr zone in Vernon River. No speeding observed.

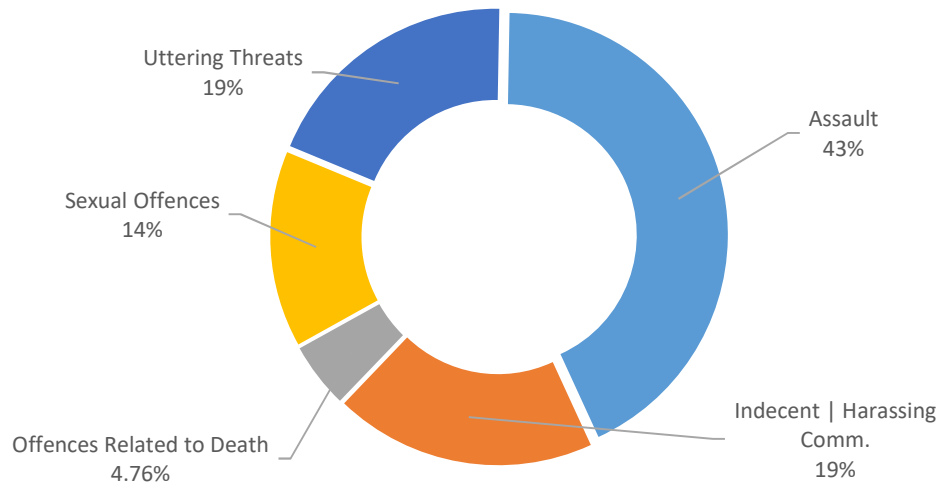


336 Founded/SUI of 352 Total Occurrences

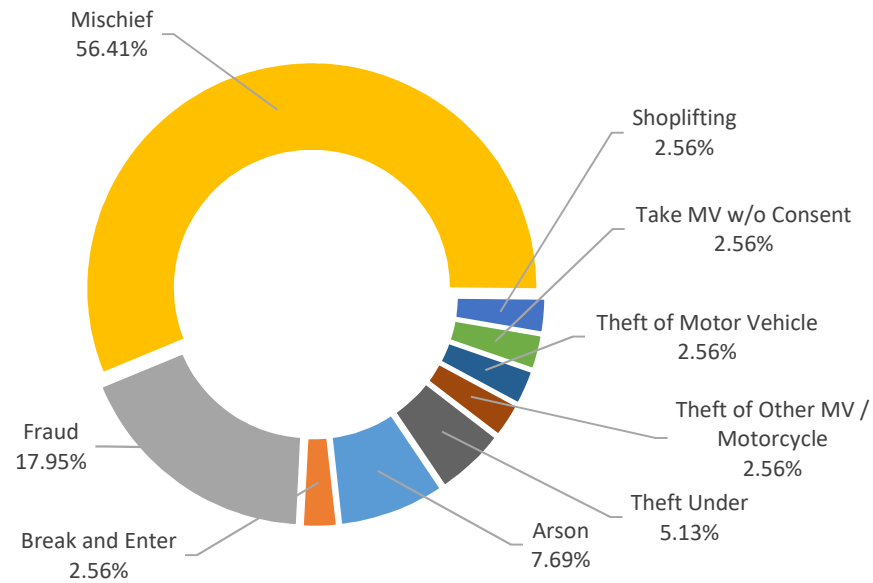


21 Founded/SUI of 352 Total Occurrences

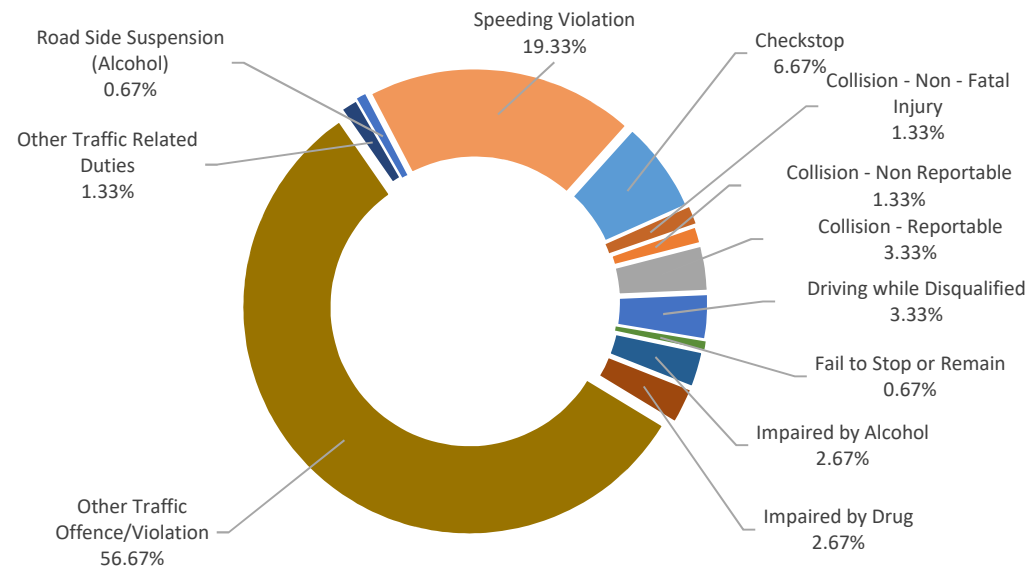


14 Founded/SUI of 352 Total Occurrences

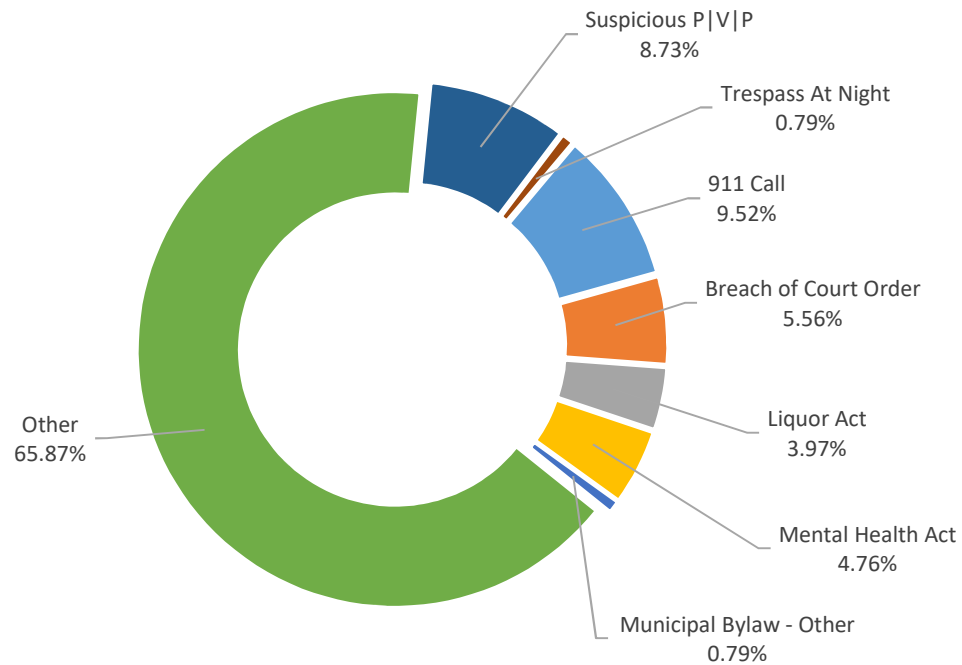


150 Founded/SUI of 352 Total Occurrences

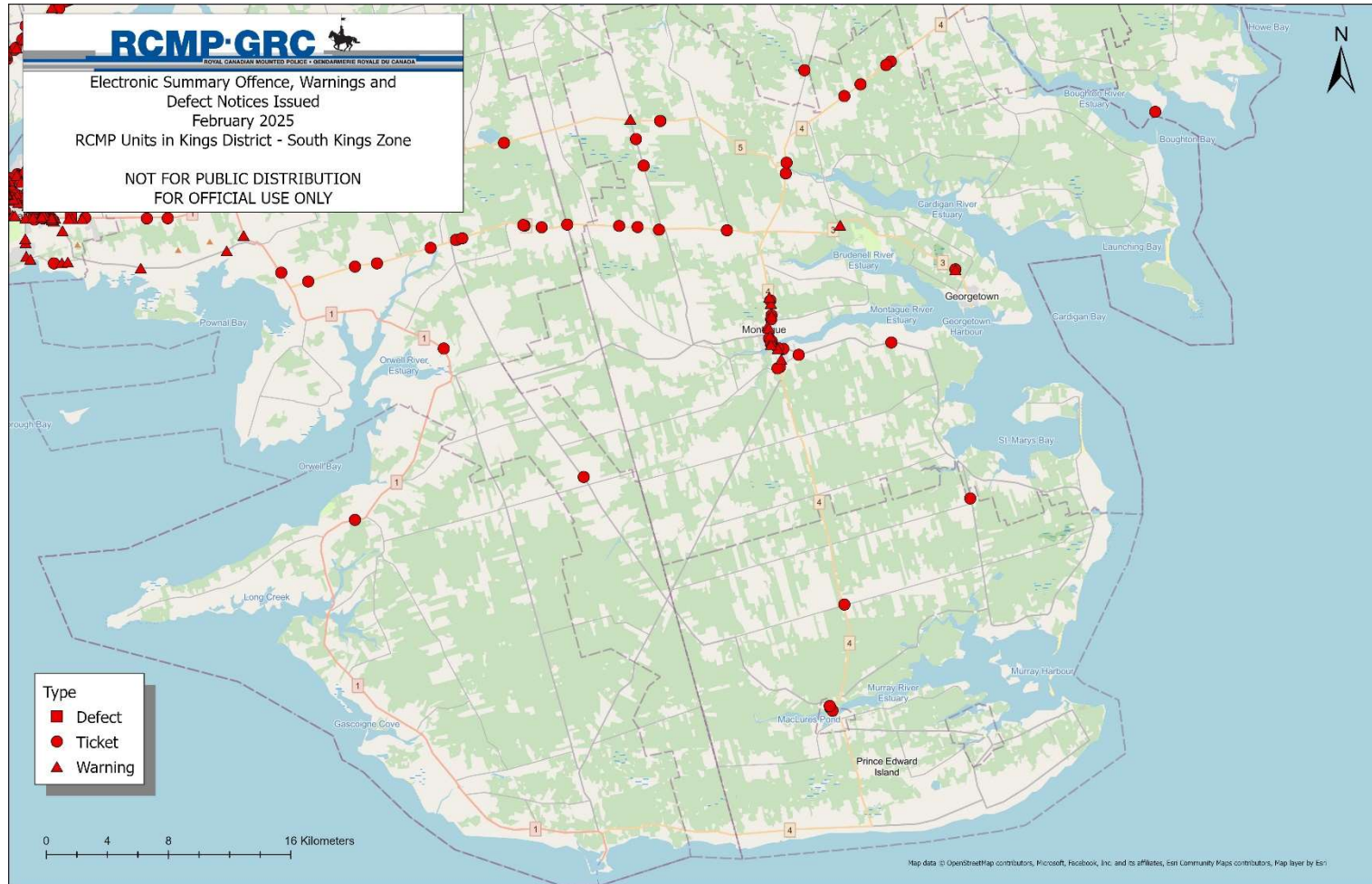

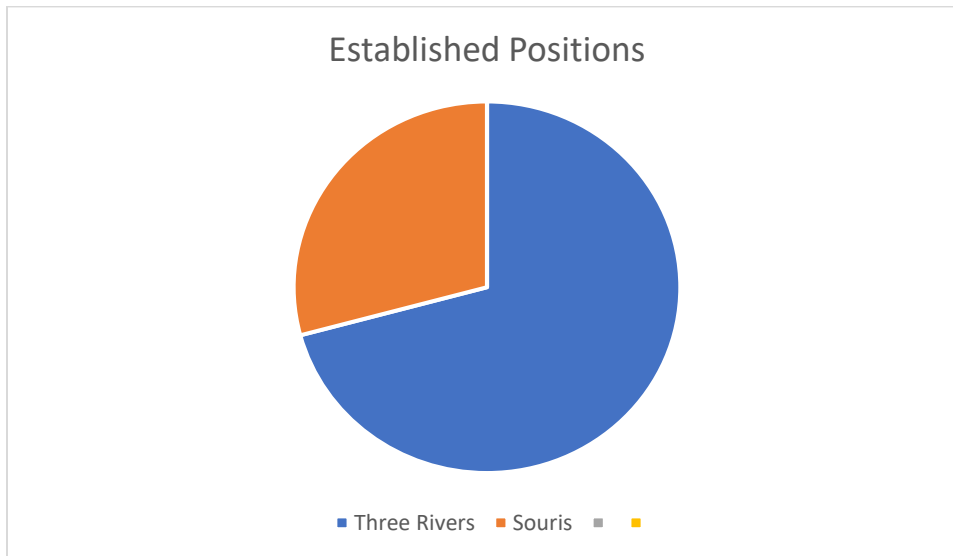
