Police Activity

Occurrence Summary

Person's crimes rose slightly in May, up to 22 from the 19 observed in April. Uttering threats and assault both shared the most frequent category, with eight occurrences each. Assaults saw two occurrences cleared by charge/charge recommended, with one uttering threat cleared by charge/charge recommended. Three sexual offences were reported in May, with one cleared by charge/charge recommended and two remain open/still under investigation.

Property crime also rose slightly in May, up six occurrences from April to end the month with 46. There were three break and enters reported, of which two remain open/still under investigation. Mischief accounted for the most activity with 16 occurrences, while theft under \$5000 had 10. There were six thefts from motor vehicles, four of which occurred on the first weekend of May in Georgetown. One of these occurrences remains open/still under investigation.

Six drug enforcement occurrences were reported, three trafficking, one of possession and two non-criminal. One of the trafficking occurrences resulted in charges laid/recommended (for trafficking in cocaine) while another is open/still under investigation.

Traffic enforcement occurrences increased again in May, rising to 220 from 186 in April. Impaired driving occurrences accounted for eight, with four by alcohol (charges laid/recommended in one), three by drug (charges laid/recommended in two) and one by a combination of drug and alcohol (also cleared by charge/charge recommended). There were two flight from police, both of which are open/still under investigation. Speeding violations accounted for 77 occurrences, with 93 other traffic offences/violations. Checkstops were documented, and no fatal collisions reported.

Overall, 491 occurrences were recorded with 480 of these being founded or still under investigation. This is higher than May 2024, when 379 occurrences (with 365 founded/SUI) were reported, and last month, when 393 occurrences, with 378 founded/SUI, were reported.



Community Policing

Policing Initiatives

An individual was arrested for possession of drugs for the purpose of trafficking in Montague. Kings RCMP also investigated and recovered a trailer containing high valued tools in Cardigan in addition to recovering three stolen trucks in May. Police also executed a search warrant in Lower Newtown and recovered stolen property and assisted with a Hot Air Balloon emergency landing. Kings' members also performed 6 curfew checks, arrested 3 individuals on outstanding warrants and monitored 3 people released after incarceration that included post release visits and we partnered with the Parole Board to monitor 1 subject in the community or provide disclosure to assist with their decisions. Members were also provided with training in use of Drones, Mentorship, Digital Technologies and Impaired Driving.

Traffic Enforcement

11 checkstops were completed in Peakes and Lewes (May 1), Souris (May 6), Caledonia (May 14), Eldon (May 14), Pisquid West (May 16), Vernon River, Gaspereaux and Wood Islands (May 19) Pisquid West (May 27), Flat River (May 29).

4 Selective Traffic Enforcement efforts were conducted focusing on school zone, stop signs and speed in Valleyfield (May 9), Montague (May 13), Lower Montague x2 (May 14/30)

Hundreds of vehicles were checked during the checkstops and only minor traffic offences were observed ranging from verbal and written warnings to summary offence tickets

Road Safety Week occurred during May 13-19 across PEI which saw targeting of various traffic offences. In total 22 checkpoints were conducted across the Island. Thousands of vehicles checked and detection of impaired drivers, summary offence tickets and warnings. 6 of those checkstops were conducted in Kings with hundreds of vehicles checked

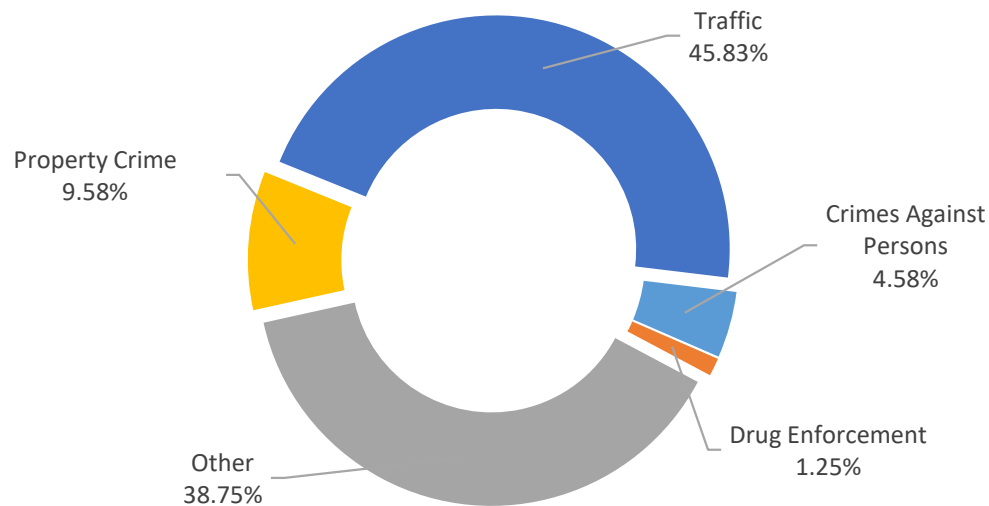

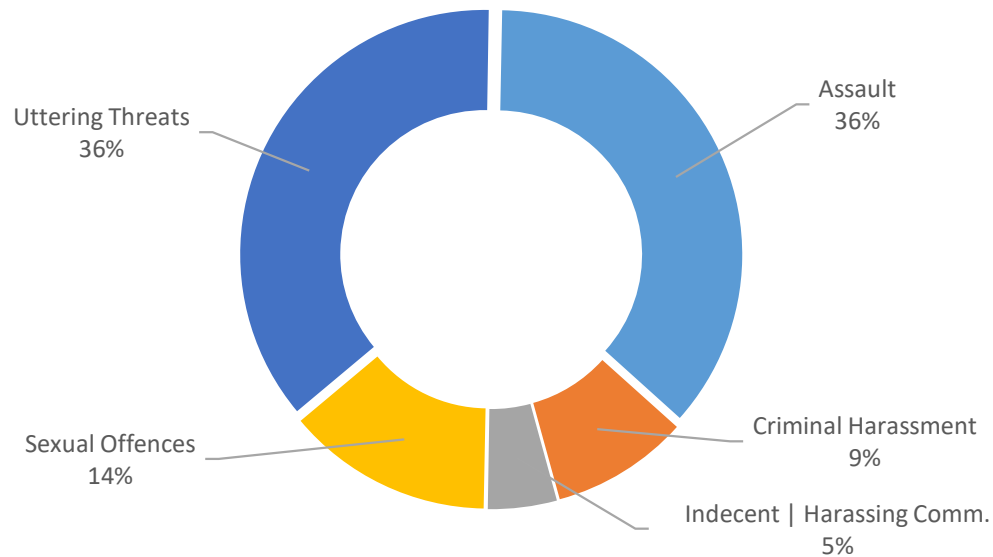


480 Founded/SUI of 491 Total Occurrences

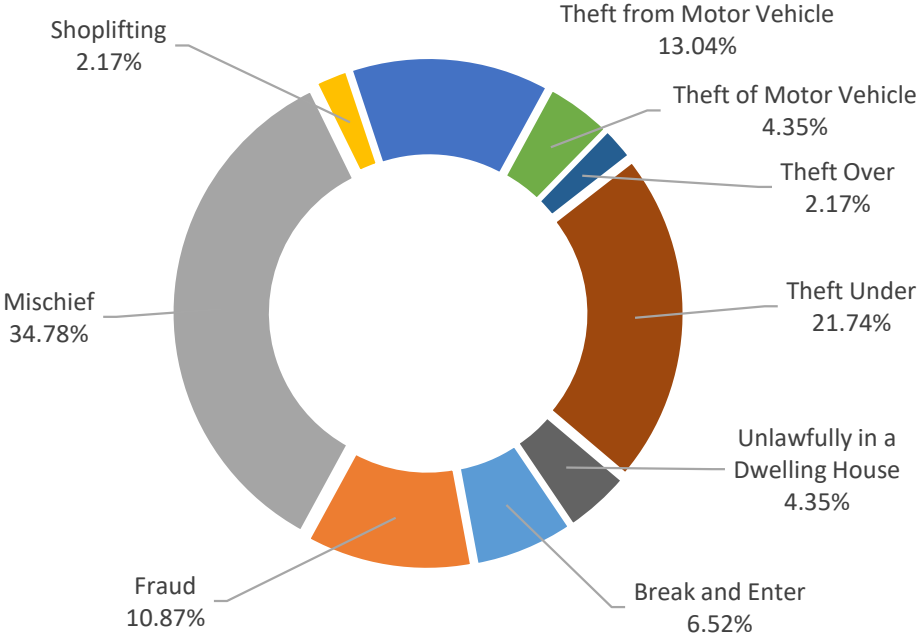


22 Founded/SUI of 491 Total Occurrences

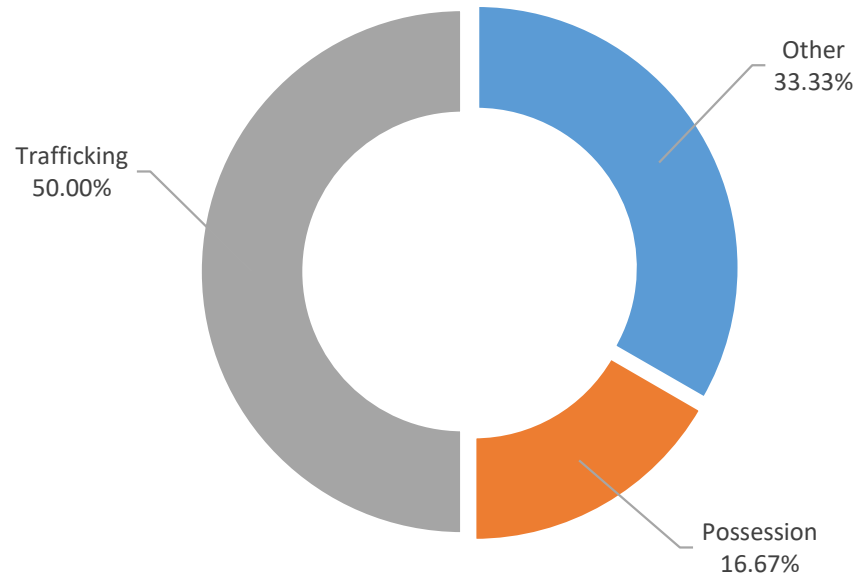


46 Founded/SUI of 491 Total Occurrences

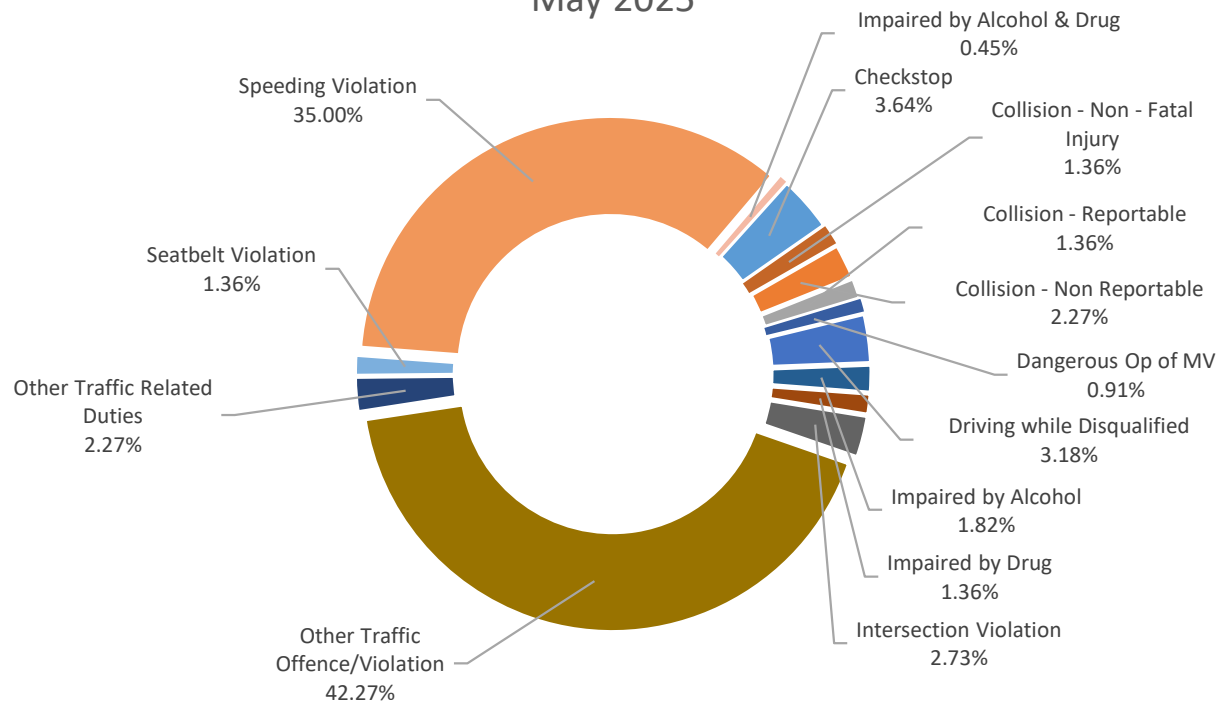


6 Founded/SUI of 491 Total Occurrences

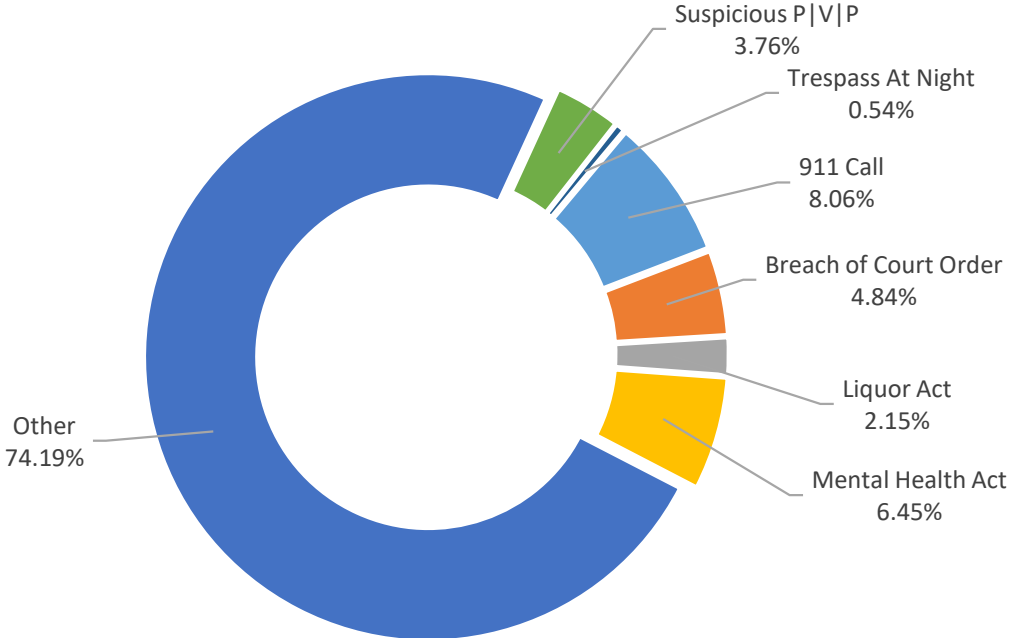


220 Founded/SUI of 491 Total Occurrences
