Police Activity

Occurrence Summary

Persons crimes in July remained consistent with both May and June, ending the month with 25 occurrences. Assaults rose to 14 over the 12 observed in June, followed by uttering threats with six occurrences. The remaining activity saw three criminal harassment occurrences, a single indecent/harassing communication, and a single sexual offence reported. Five of the assaults and two of the uttering threats were all concluded with charges laid/recommended.

Property crime rose sharply in July, increasing to 63 occurrences, up from 46 in June. A single break and enter was reported, which is still open/under investigation. There were five theft of motor vehicles/taking motor vehicle without consent, which is a significant jump as the 12-month average for theft of motor vehicle is one occurrence. Mischief (27), theft under \$5000 (11) and fraud (10) occurrences all made up for most of the activity.

A single drug enforcement occurrence, possession-related, was reported in July.

Traffic enforcement occurrences decreased in July, down to 137 in the month from 178 observed in June. Impaired driving occurrences accounted for 10, with seven by alcohol and three by alcohol and drugs combined. Of these, two of the alcohol-based occurrences, and one of the combined occurrences resulted in charges laid/recommended. A failure/refusal (to provide a breath sample) was also reported, which also resulted in charges laid/recommended. There were 31 speeding violates reported with an additional 68 traffic offences/violations. There were no fatal collisions in July, and two Checkstops were documented.

Overall, 396 occurrences were recorded with 382 of these being founded or still under investigation. This is slightly lower than July 2024, when 406 occurrences (with 383 founded/SUI) were reported, and lower than last month, when 455 occurrences, with 430 founded/SUI, were reported.



Community Policing

Policing Initiatives

Kings RCMP attempted to stop a vehicle with several observable deficiencies in Souris. The vehicle fled but was not pursued however alternative investigative efforts lead investigators to identify and locate the driver later and outside of the vehicle. He was arrested and charged with multiple offences under the HTA and Criminal Code. Kings RCMP also attended a non-criminal single vehicle fatal collision in Annandale, a collision and entrapment in New Perth and several break and enters in Cable Head, Bristol, Cardigan, Selkirk, Green Meadows, Bay Fortune and Dingwell Mills. Kings members also performed 3 curfew checks, arrested 4 individuals on outstanding warrants and monitored 6 people released after incarceration that included post release visits and we partnered with Parole to monitor 2 subjects in our communities. Members attended community events in Belfast, Montague, Brudenell, Cardigan, Souris, Wood Islands, Murray River and St Peters and presented to seniors on Fraud awareness.

Traffic Enforcement Program

- Checkstops were completed in Vernon Bridge, Murray River, Pisquid West, Dingwell Mills and Bridgetown.
- Dedicated Traffic Service patrols were conducted in Montague on 5 different dates and in Souris on 6 different dates.
- 2025-07-04 – Route 1, Vernon Bridge - While conducting a Checkstop, speed enforcement was conducted using a handheld radar. Five summary offence tickets were issued.

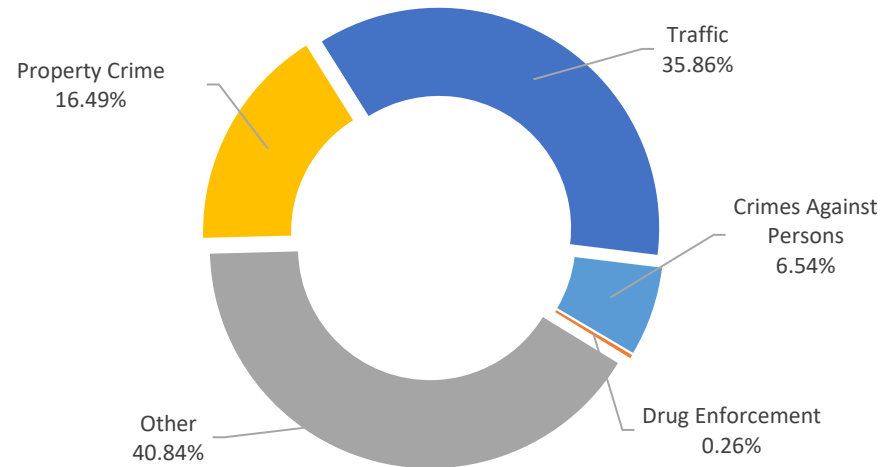

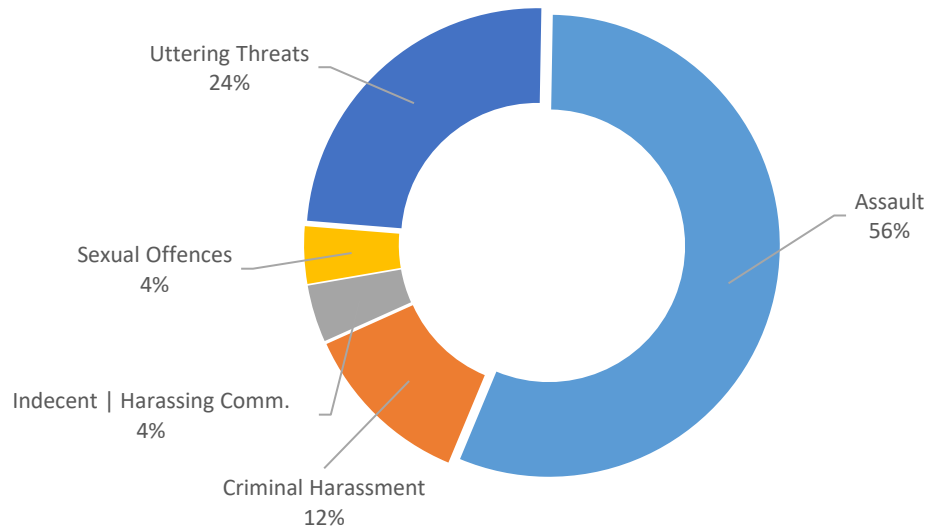


382 Founded/SUI of 396 Total Occurrences

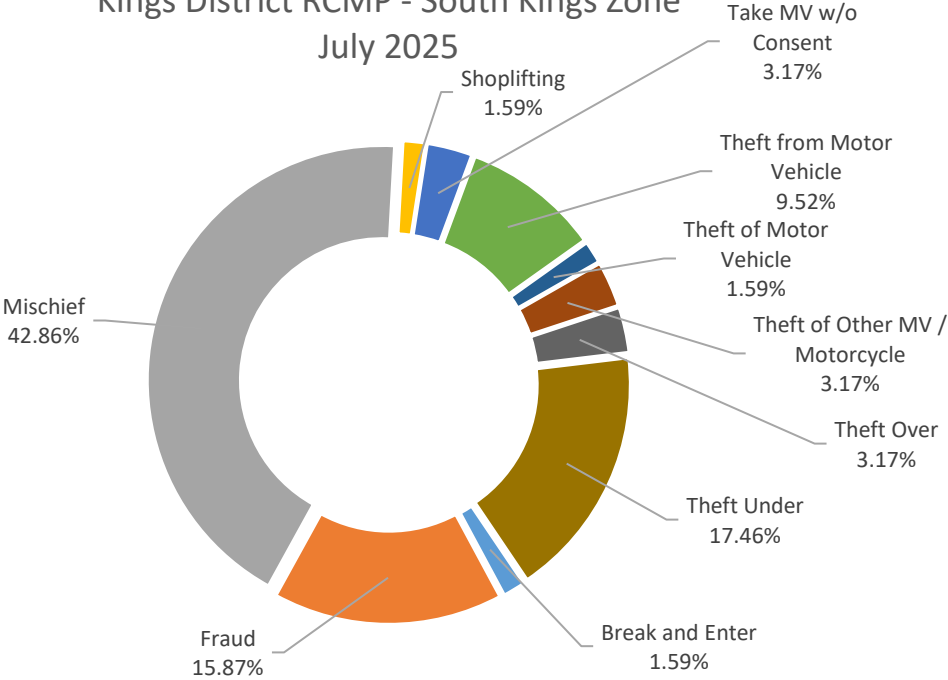


25 Founded/SUI of 396 Total Occurrences

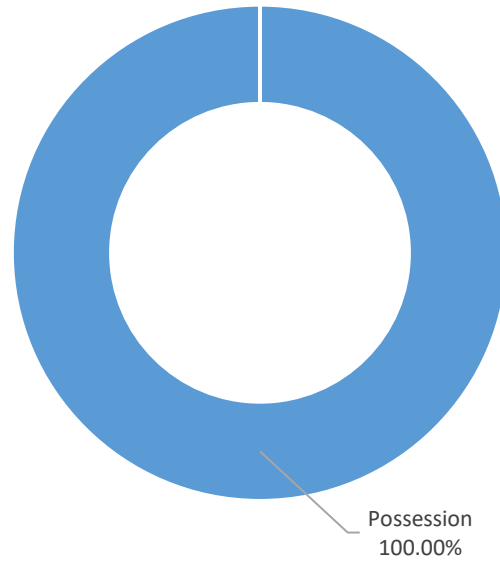


63 Founded/SUI of 396 Total Occurrences

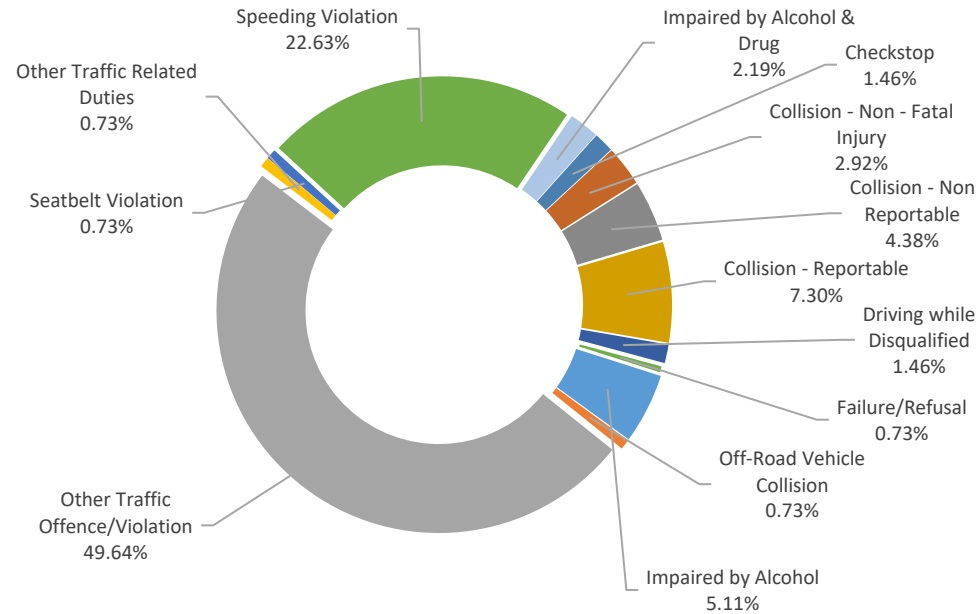

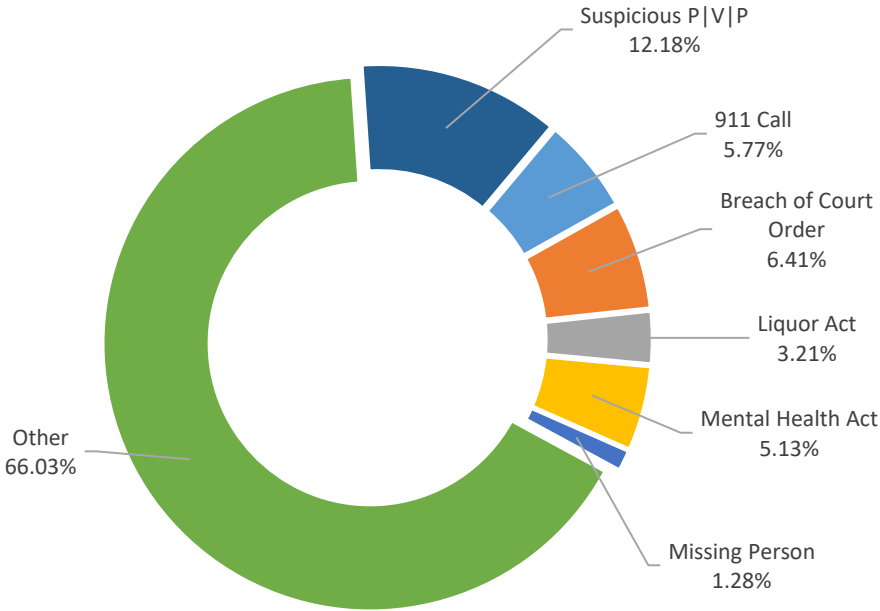
