Police Activity

Occurrence Summary

Persons crime rose in October, ending the month with 26, up from 19 in September. Uttering threats was the most frequent with nine occurrences, followed by assault with seven (four of these resulted in charges laid/recommended). A single sexual offence was reported, which is still open/under investigation.

Property crime fell only slightly from September's 47, ending October with 44 occurrences. Mischief accounted for 23 of these, followed by theft under \$5000 with nine. There were three break and enters, and a single arson occurred during the month which remains under investigation.

A single drug trafficking file was reported, which was concluded with insufficient evidence to proceed.

Traffic occurrences accounted for 255 occurrences, up over 186 occurrences in September. Three impaired drivers were reported, and all were concluded with insufficient evidence to proceed. Speeding accounted for 108 occurrences, followed by 89 occurrences of other traffic offences/violations. A single fatal collision occurred in the district in October, and there were nine Checkstops conducted.

Overall, 530 occurrences were recorded with 516 of these being founded or still under investigation. This is higher than last month, with 430 occurrences, of which 422 were founded/SUI. The month is also higher than October 2024, when 354 occurrences, with 332 founded/SUI, were reported.



Community Policing

Policing Initiatives

In Kings District the RCMP investigated an Impaired Driver in St. Peters who was found to be three times the legal limit. Kings District also uncovered nine disqualified drivers in Souris, Montgaue, Roseneath, Murray River, Elliotvale, Mt Albion and Millview. A reported stolen truck from Alliston was located and recovered in Montague and remains still under investigation. A fraud in the thousands of dollars was investigated in Morell and resulted in charges. A collision in Peakes that saw multiple agencies respond, was attended and one driver determined to be at fault and served a violation ticket. A single non-criminal fatal collision was attended in Commercial Cross. Kings' members also performed seven targeted release order compliance checks where three individuals were found to be in breach and arrested. We also partnered with electronic monitoring in seven cases and made time to attend community events in Georgetown, Murray River, Montague and Souris. 15 employees received annual mandatory training and two more were sent on investigative and communication training respectively.

Traffic Enforcement Programs

- Checkstops were completed in Vernon River (Oct 8), Operation Impact (Oct 12) saw checkstops in Brudenell, Milltown Cross, Caledonia, Baldwin Road, and Abney, New Zealand (Oct 13), Bridgetown (Oct 16), Lower Montague (Oct 23), Bridgetown (Oct 24) over 300 vehicles were checked, summary offence tickets and warnings were issued and roadside screening tests requested all resulting in no detection of alcohol.
- Specific traffic enforcement occurrences were completed in Belfast and Montague (Oct 1), Souris (Oct 2), Murray River (Oct 4), Route 3 (Oct 21), Summerville (Oct 22 and 30), Morell (Oct 23), New Perth (Oct 30), several violators were charged under the HTA for speed infractions.
- The provincial traffic unit conducted 25 traffic patrols to Souris and 24 to Three Rivers in October.

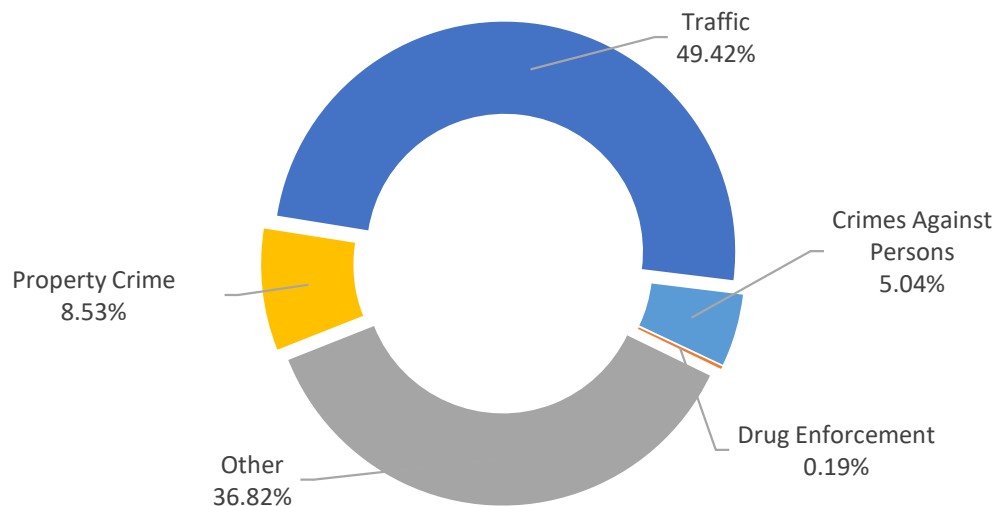

October 2025

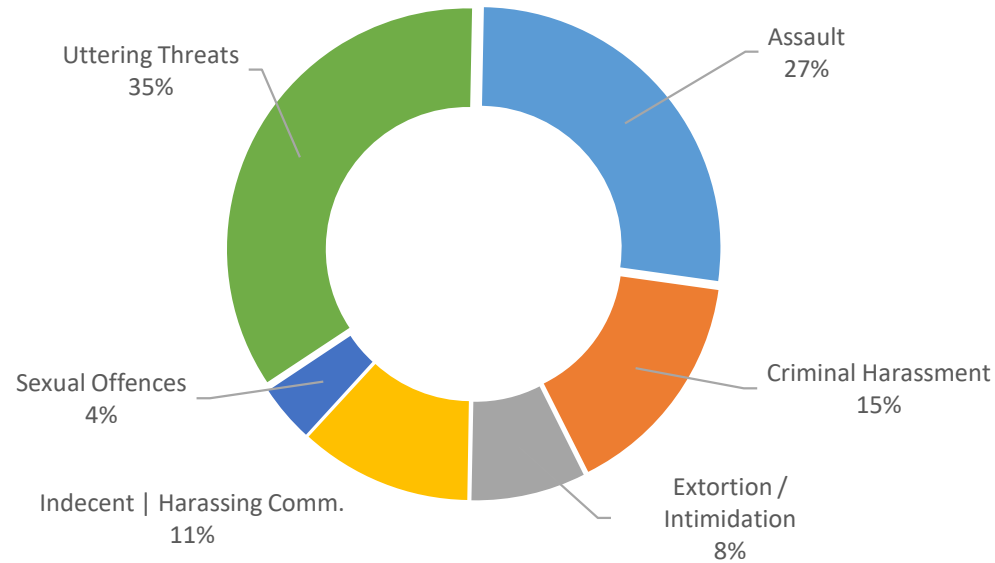


516 Founded/SUI of 530 Total Occurrences

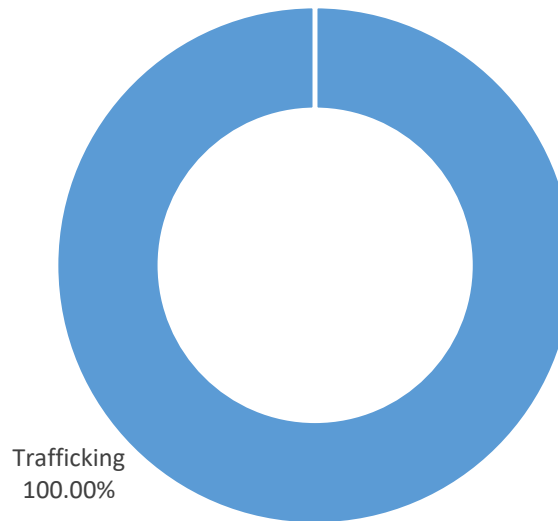


26 Founded/SUI of 530 Total Occurrences

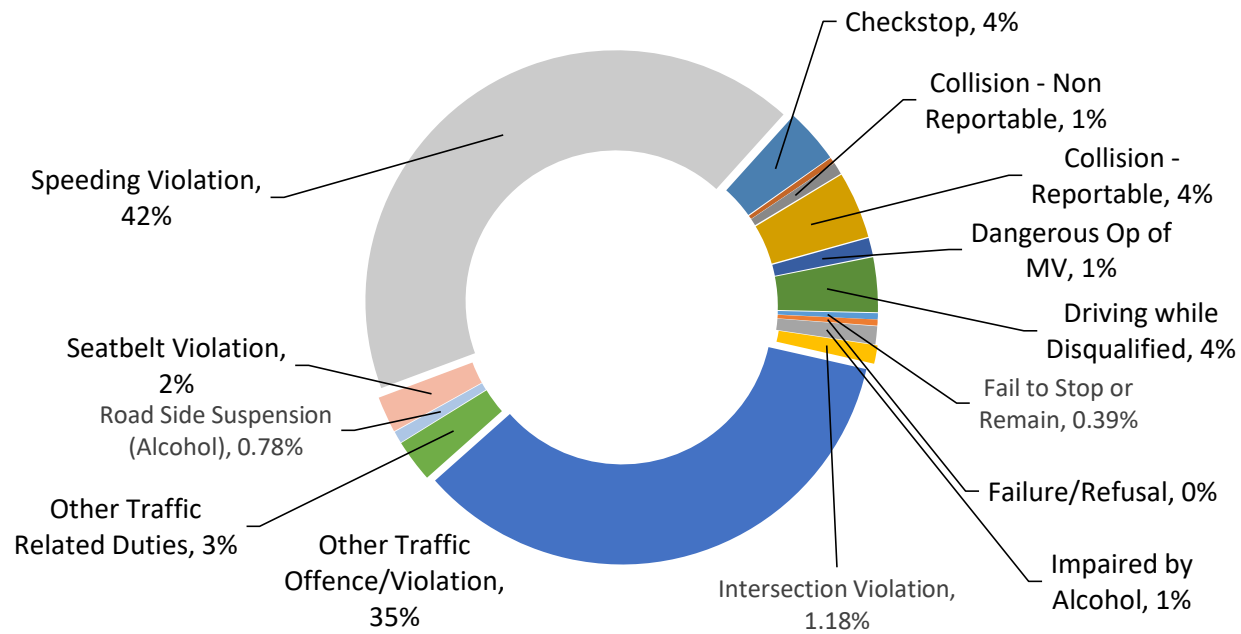


1 Founded/SUI of 530 Total Occurrences

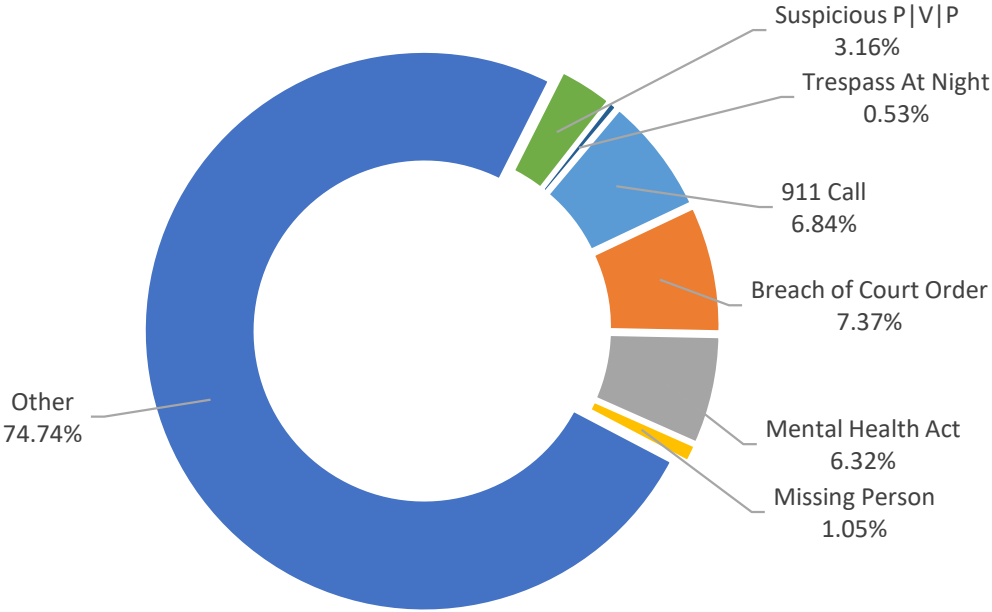


255 Founded/SUI of 530 Total Occurrences
